The roar of motorcycle engines will be heard in Niagara-on-the-Lake next Saturday, as about 200 riders rev up to raise money for prostate cancer research.

The Telus Motorcycle Ride for Dad begins at 9 a.m. June 18 from the Royal Canadian Legion Hall on King Street.

The ride is a Canada-wide event started by police officers 15 years ago, but funds raised from the local ride stay in the area to support prostate cancer research and awareness, Since 2000, the Telus Ride For Dad has donated more than \$15 million for the Prostate Cancer Fight Foundation across the country.

In Niagara, where the ride began just

six years ago, \$32,500 has been raised, and this year will help fund a new Niagara Health System research project.

Mathew King, a detective constable with the Niagara Regional Police and one of the event organizers, explained the money will fund a SABR technology trial, an advanced radiation treatment for prostate cancer that reduces the number of treatments from 39 to just five.

Ride day registration begins at 7 a.m. at the NOTL legion hall. The ride ends with closing ceremonies at Club Italia pavilion, 2525 Montrose Rd., with a spaghetti dinner at the end of the ride for participants. There are poker run and top pledge prizes.
